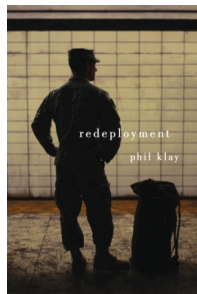
Rabih Alameddine - An Unnecessary Woman
