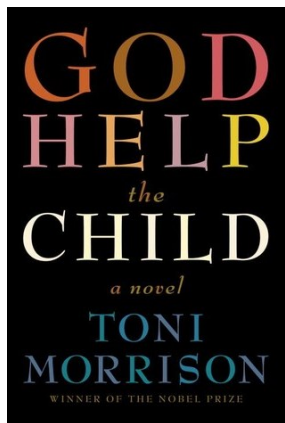


FIC KNOLL - *Luckiest Girl Alive* (on order)

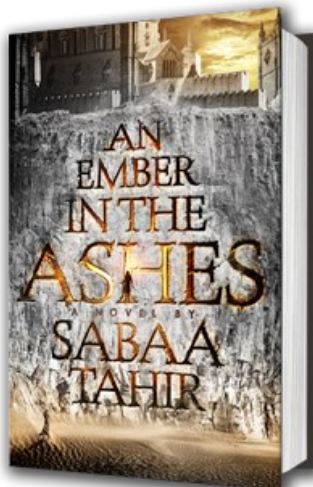


FIC PICOULT - *Off the Page*

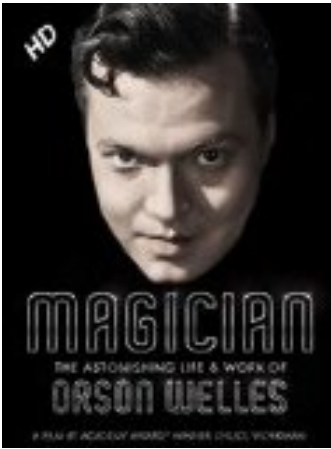
FIC TAHIR - *An Ember in the Ashes*

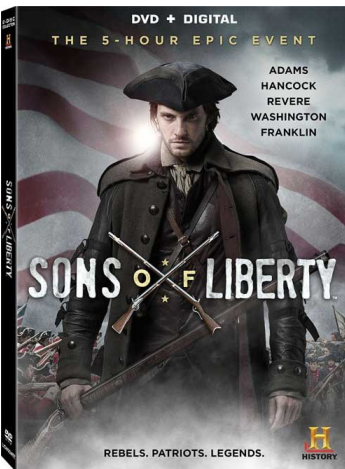
DVD B WELLES - *Magician: The Astonishing Life and Work of Orson Welles* (2015) (on order)
