POSITIVES

- 5th graders ready for more variety in their day
- Promote independence, organizational skills, and responsibilities
- Know the middle level goals, routines and procedures
- 5-6 grouping possibilities
- 6th grade year is smoother
- Leadership opportunities for older students
- Fits the facilities needs
- More extra-curricular opportunities
- Eases students into the middle school
- Academic and behavioral expectations strengthen over 4 years
- Fun to have age range
- 5th graders are great!

CHALLENGES

- Some 5th graders have difficult time with transition to teams
- Bus (1 school reported)
- Training for 5th grade staff on middle level education
- Educating parents and community
- Easing parent concerns
- Making sure 5th grade is a part of the larger school
- Providing opportunities for 5-8 to get together
- Scheduling
- Earlier start time
- Shorter recesses
- Space
- Curriculum focus

STAFFING

Recommendation:

- 8 Classroom Teachers
- 1 Special Education Teacher
- 1 Special Education Education Technician
- Part Time PE, Art, Music
- Part Time Library Support
- Part Time Gifted and Talented
- Part Time Guidance Counselor
- Rtl/Support Teachers
- Custodial
- Lunch duty assistance
- Part Time Secretary
- Part Time Technology Integrator

SCHEDULE

Recommendation: 5th grade starting and ending at the same time as 6-8.

- Add a lunch time
- Add a recess time
- Ensure 1.5 hours for literacy and 1 hour for math

STAFF TRANSITION

Recommendation: 3 half-day sessions for staff transition, with multiple visitations throughout the year.

- Professional development on Middle Level Model-(This We Believe and Bright Futures)
- BJHS Administration attend staff meetings/5th grade team meetings
- 4 Visitations to HBS by BJHS staff
- 4 Visitations to BJHS by HBS staff

PARENT TRANSITION

Recommendation: A year long plan with multiple opportunities for parents to learn about Brunswick Junior High School.

- Survey: Early October
- 4 "Meet in the Middle" offerings during the day for parents to come and see the school in action throughout the year
- 3 Parent Informational Evenings

STUDENT TRANSITION

Recommendation: A year long plan with visitations to and from Harriet Beecher Stowe.

- BJHS staff visit HBS to talk with students
- BJHS students visit HBS to talk with students
- Step up day
- Informal visitations for various reasons
- HBS and BJHS classes pair up for activities
- Peer Partners

CONFIGURATIONS

Recommendation: Multiple class configurations for staff and students.

- Self Contained
- 2 person teams
- 3 person teams
- 4 person teams

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Recommendation: Add 6 extra-curricular stipends to provide more offerings for 5th graders. Most extra-curricular activities to be structured 5/6 and 7/8.

FACILITIES

Recommendation: Provide 5th grade with a separate space at Brunswick Junior High School.

- Long term portable unit-preferably connected to the school (4 unit)
- Wholesale review of school layout
- Consolidation of current support classrooms
- Storage
- Location of additional diversified studies classes
- Bathrooms
- Special education needs

TRANSPORTATION

Recommendation: Study on the following transportation items:

- More buses or longer runs
- Parking for staff, parents, and visitors
- More parents at drop off or pick up
- More bike racks

EQUIPMENT AND FURNITURE

Recommendation: The following equipment and furniture for the 8 classrooms:

- Student desks and chairs
- Teacher desks and chairs
- Storage cabinets
- Bulletin Boards/Whiteboards
- Bookshelves
- Phones
- Large tables
- Sink
- Cubbies
- Technology listed separately

TECHNOLOGY

Recommendation: The following technology to assist 5th grade students and staff:

- Projectors
- Document Cameras
- Mobile Laptop Cart(s)
- Interactive whiteboard with speakers
- Computers for teachers
- Report card technology

POSITIVES

- Relieves crowding at HBS
- Provides opportunities for different configurations (teaming)
- More opportunities for extra-curricular activities
- Less space needed at a new elementary construction
- Integrates students into a middle level model that meet many developmental needs of this age group

CHALLENGES

- Old building-adding another grade level with increase wear, tear and crowding
- Need for additional space for multiple years
- Transition planning for staff/students/parents
- Transient staff-location and schedule of classes
- Moving Logistics
