Our Learning Targets

If you own a global positioning system (GPS), you probably can't imagine taking a trip without it. Unlike a printed map, a GPS provides up-to-the-minute information about where you are, the distance to your destination, how long until you get there, and exactly what to do when you make a wrong turn. But a GPS can't do any of that without a precise description of where you want to go.

Think of shared learning targets in the same way.

In our classroom we have a LEARNING TARGET board as well as <u>Maps for Learning</u> charts. These visuals convey to students the destination for the lesson or unit—what to learn, and exactly how to demonstrate their new learning.

Reading Workshop 🗳



We have been working on the comprehension strategy of retelling. This strategy provides an opportunity for readers to recall what is happening in the story they are reading. It allows a reader to stop and monitor their understanding.

Retelling a story is like putting together a puzzle. The reader must make sure that they have all of the pieces so that it makes a picture. This includes *characters, setting, problem, and the solution or the main ideas of the text.* When a reader retells a story to other people, they should be able to picture what the story is about in their head.

How can you help your child with this strategy at home?

- When you are reading with your child, stop and have your child tell you what is happening in the story using the words: *first, next, then, after that, and finally.*
- Allow your child to become comfortable with the strategy of retelling by retelling events they are familiar with. This will also help your child focus on weeding out the **minor details** by centering their attention on **what's important**. Here are some ideas:
 - Tell me about the first time you lost a tooth.
 - Tell me about a time you went to a birthday party.



Word Study study

In handwriting we have been practicing our number writing. This year we are piloting a handwriting program called: *Handwriting Without Tears.* I will share this work with you during our conference time.

Making Words is an important hands-on activity that children work on in class. At least once or twice a week, children "learn by doing" to make words. As children manipulate the given letters, they discover more about letter-sound relationships, and as they look for patterns in words, they see how these letter-sound relationships work in words. These two activities help children read and spell even more words!





Math Workshop We will soon begin Chapter 5 Shapes and Patterns. I am sending home the Math in Focus School to Home Connections for both Chapter 4 and 5. We will be learning about plane and solid shapes. You can help your child identify these 2 and 3-dimensional shapes in familiar household objects.
