# **Reading At Home**

I would like to thank-you for listening to your child practice their reading every day. Giving your child lots of opportunities to read aloud will help strengthen their reading skills and build their reading stamina. Two easy ways you can help your child become a confident reader. Try a tip each week and see what works best for you and your child.

### Once is not enough

Encourage your child to re-read their books, chapters, and shared reading poems. Re-reading helps them read fluently and accurately, deepens their story meaning, allows them to notice more visual information, and increases their sight vocabulary in a meaningful way.

#### • One more time with feeling

When your child has figured out an unfamiliar or tricky word, have him or her re-read that sentence. Often they are so busy figuring out a word they lose the meaning of what they've just read.

#### **Spelling**

Attached you will find a list of Grade 1 Core Words and Priority Words. I cannot stress to you enough the importance of practicing these words with your child on a regular basis.

The lists are divided into two parts:

**Core Words**: They are the seeds from which this spelling program grows and develops. They provide a foundation for each grade level to begin spelling exploration and are a springboard for the study of hundreds of additional words.

**Priority Words:** They are high frequency words called "No Excuses" words. Students are held accountable for knowing these words. They are expected to spell them correctly in all of their everyday writing. These words are taken from the list of core words. Most children will master these by the end of his/her grade level.

### How can you help?

Please help your child to spell these words correctly in their everyday writing. Each week, make flashcards of 3 to 5 words. Have your child practice reading and spelling these words every day. Remember, the goal is mastery by the end of first grade for the "No Excuse Words."

#### Science and Social Studies Update
