Bounce or toss a ball to the beat of a favorite song, alone or with another person	Wrap up warmly, take a piece of paper and something to write with, and sit outside. Fill 3 glasses with different levels of water. Tap with a pencil. Can you play "Hot Cross Buns"?	Draw notes on rocks with a marker. Arrange into patterns.
Go outside for a walk. Listen for high and low sounds, and loud and quiet sounds.	Clap the beat of a favorite song, then try clapping the rhythm of the words	Sing or play an instrument to a friend or relative using a phone or live video.	Use objects that make sound (found sounds) and add those sounds to a story.	Sing "Twinkle Twinkle Little Star" using words about staying at home.
Using a stuffed animal, sing a song in the stuffed animal's voice.	See how many words you can spell using only the letters of the musical alphabet (A, B, C, D, E, F, G)	FREE SPACE	Sing along with a favorite song using a spoon as a microphone	Use body percussion (pats, claps, snaps) to go along with a favorite song.
Play an instrument.	Create notes or instruments using Play-Doh.	Using a flashlight, draw shapes on the wall. Make your voice follow the shape you draw.	Use a towel or scarf to make up a dance routine for a favorite song. Use shapes and patterns.	Make shakers by putting small things into plastic bottles. Listen to your different shaker sounds.
Hum or la-la-la music to your favorite video game. Ask someone to guess what you are humming.	Listen for and name some instruments you hear in a song .	Dance to some favorite music.	Make a drum set out of stuff you have at home. Play it with a song.	Listen to a song you don't know. Keep the beat by walking a silly walk around the room!
