| Writing Handwriting Practice | Good handwriting makes your work easier to read. Every day this week find a sentence to copy in your best handwriting. Use the attached sheet for ideas. | Handwriting Tip #1 Always start your letters at the top! | Handwriting Tip #2 Letters should sit on the line no floating! | Handwriting Tip #3 Letters should be in proportion to each other some are small, some are tall, and some are descending (they hang down). | Handwriting Tip #4 Remember that lots of letters start with the letter c ("c position" or "magic c" letters). c, a, o, d, g, q |

| Math Place Value | Make a Number Roll a die 2 times. Build 2 different numbers. (4,6 could be 46 or 64). Show which number is greater. (46<64. Remember the "mouth" faces the greater number.). 2nd grade, roll 3 times and order the 3 numbers. | How Many Can You Make? Use the attached game sheet. Repeat often for more practice! (The last two are more challenging!) | 100 Chart Cover You'll need: a 100s chart (attached), game directions (attached), and 2 sets of number cards made by separating the heart and diamond cards numbered 1-9 from the rest of the deck. Use the queens for the zeros! | What Numbers Are Missing? A and D See the attached worksheets. One is a warm up and one is a challenge! | Digit Challenge Each Player has a deck of cards. Divide each deck into 3 piles face down. Say "Go". Each player flips a card face up from each of their piles. Make the biggest number possible. Highest number takes the cards, Repeat. Play again, but lowest digit wins. |
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| Science Shadows | The Sun appears to Move across the sky each day. Go outside three times each day this week (moring, noon, dinnertime). Stand in the same place each time and draw where you see the sun. On Friday record what you notice. | A Shadow of Me Stand in the sun on pavement or a large piece of paper. Have a partner draw around your shadow. Draw around theirs. Come back several hours later and stand in the same place. How does your shadow look? | A Shadow of Build a small object or sculpture. (Use legos, clay, recyclables, etc Stand your object on a piece of paper in the sun. Trace around the shadow on the paper. Leave your creation in that spot. Return several times and see how the shadow has changed. Get a new piece of paper. Can you change the shape of the shadow by moving the object? Can you make the shadow disappear? | Shadows are formed when an object blocks light. Gather a variety of objects block, comb, wisk, fork, pencil, clear drinking glass, clear water bottle, etc. Be creative. Take your objects out into the sun. Do they all make shadows? Do all of the shadows look the same? | Shadows can help tell stories. You can learn to hold your hands, or arms, or body so that the shadow looks like something else. Try some yourself with directions HERE or use the attached sheet. Puppets can be made to be held in front of a light so that the shadow becomes the show.
