

Weeks 11 -- 12 of Home Learning

For these last two weeks of school we'll offer **Targeted Instruction** and **Enrichment.** Most of these activities are designed to be done at times that work best for you and are project-based instead of following the academic structure of the Home Learning Plans. Here are your choices:

- Contact your child's teacher (or math teacher) if you'd like some small group or individual virtual lessons on any particular academic topics or skills
- Take your flat teacher (a la Flat Stanley) on adventures and share those on ClassDojo, Seesaw, or on email (one great adventure per day)! Come up with your own ideas or use the ideas from the Flat Teacher Choice Board. Flat teachers can be printed here or picked up with your child's belongings
- Use the NEW Multi-Age website all summer for reading enrichment -- look for new stories as the summer goes on! (The link is coming soon!)
- Plant some seeds (materials to be picked up at Coffin with your child's belongings)
- Play the **Multi-Age Enrichment Outdoor & Plant Challenge** Goose Chase (a virtual scavenger hunt where the challenges involve spending time outside and sharing your discoveries and creations -- including your planting project) with your Multi-Age team members
- . To join, please follow these instructions:
 - 1. Download the GooseChase <u>iOS</u> or <u>Android</u> app (some of you have it already).
 - 2. Choose to play as a guest, or register for a personal account with a username & password of your choice.
 - 3. Search for and select the **Multi-Age Enrichment Outdoor & Plant Challenge** game, or search for game code **KKEJGP**.
 - 4. Follow the prompts to select or create your player profile. If prompted, the password for the game is "nature".
 - 5. The game will start on Monday June 1 at 7 AM and ends on Friday June 12 at 11 AM. You have nearly two weeks to complete all 50 missions
 - 6. Check the rankings section regularly to view others' progress AND to see if you received bonus points for your entry
