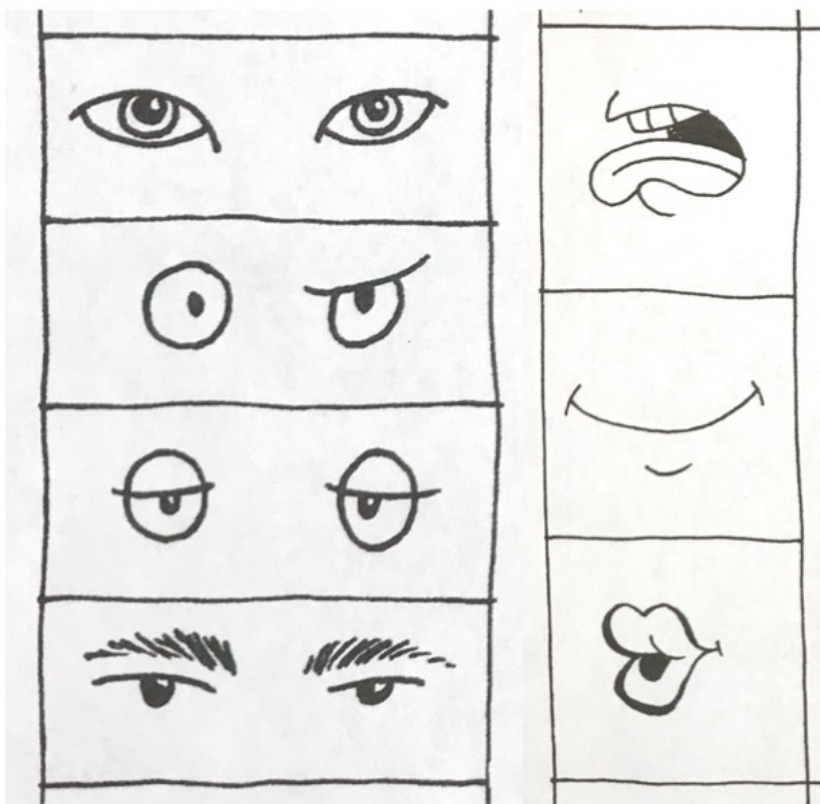

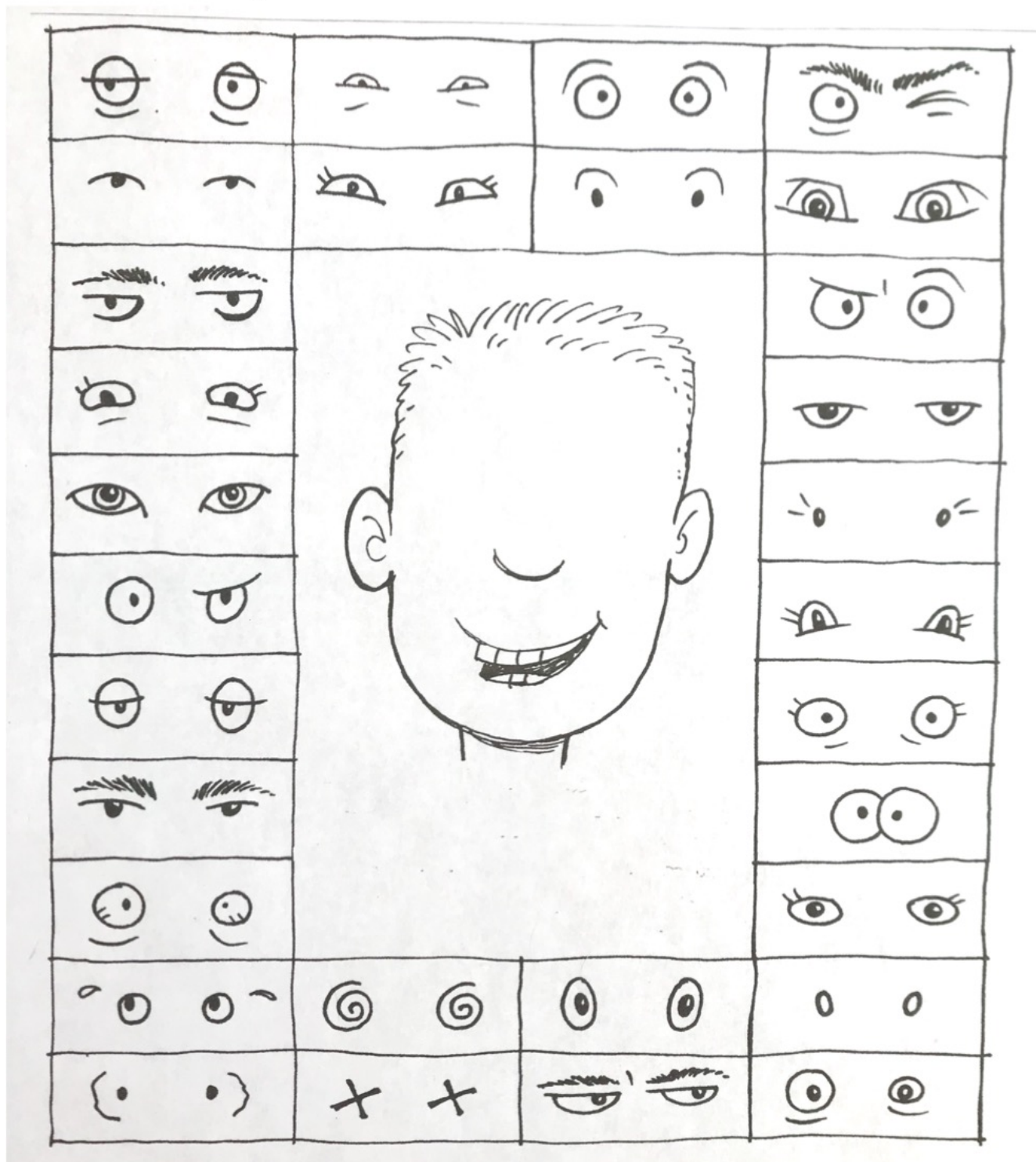

Coloring your cartoon figures can help make them seem more alive and playful.

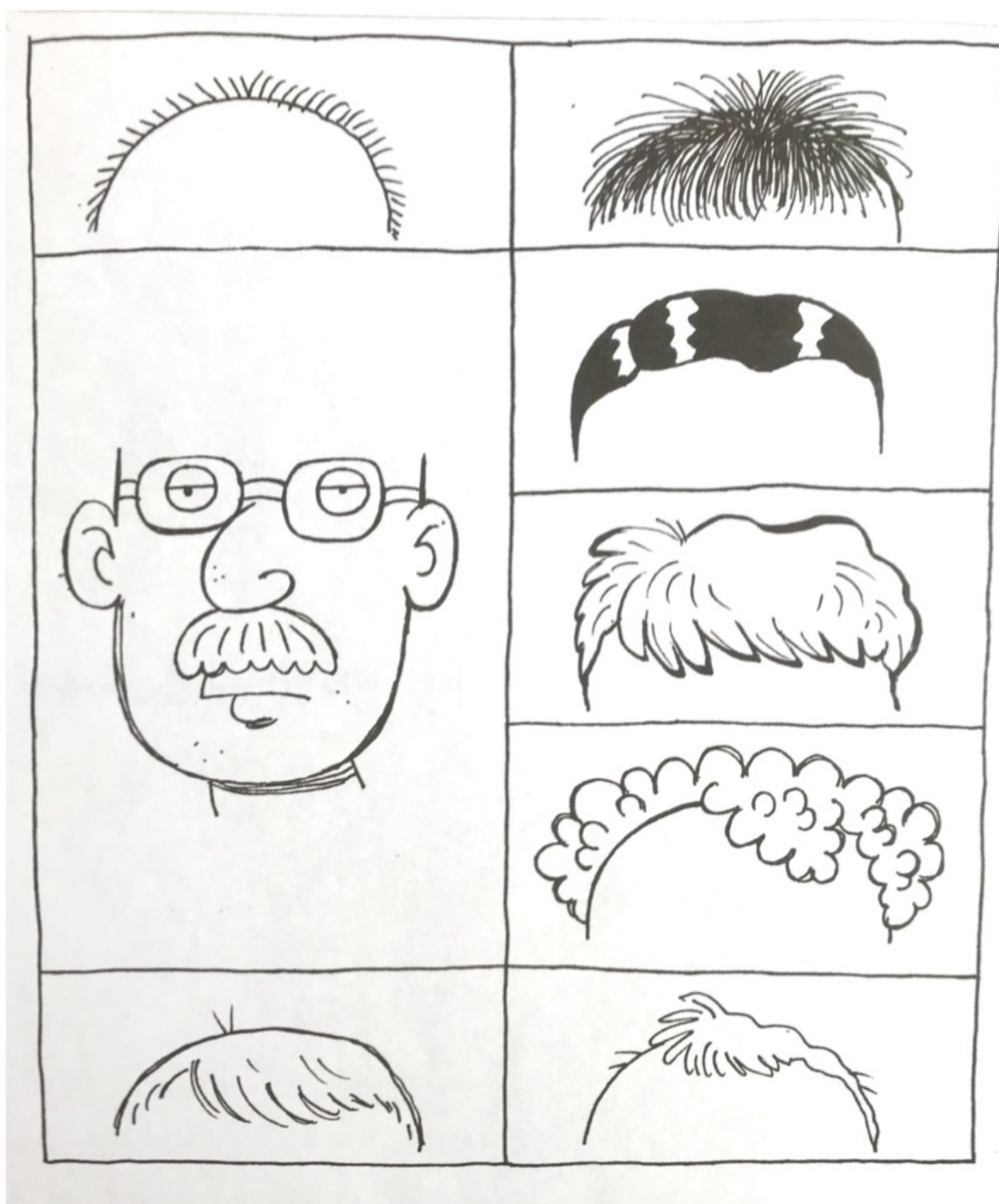
Details: The Eyes

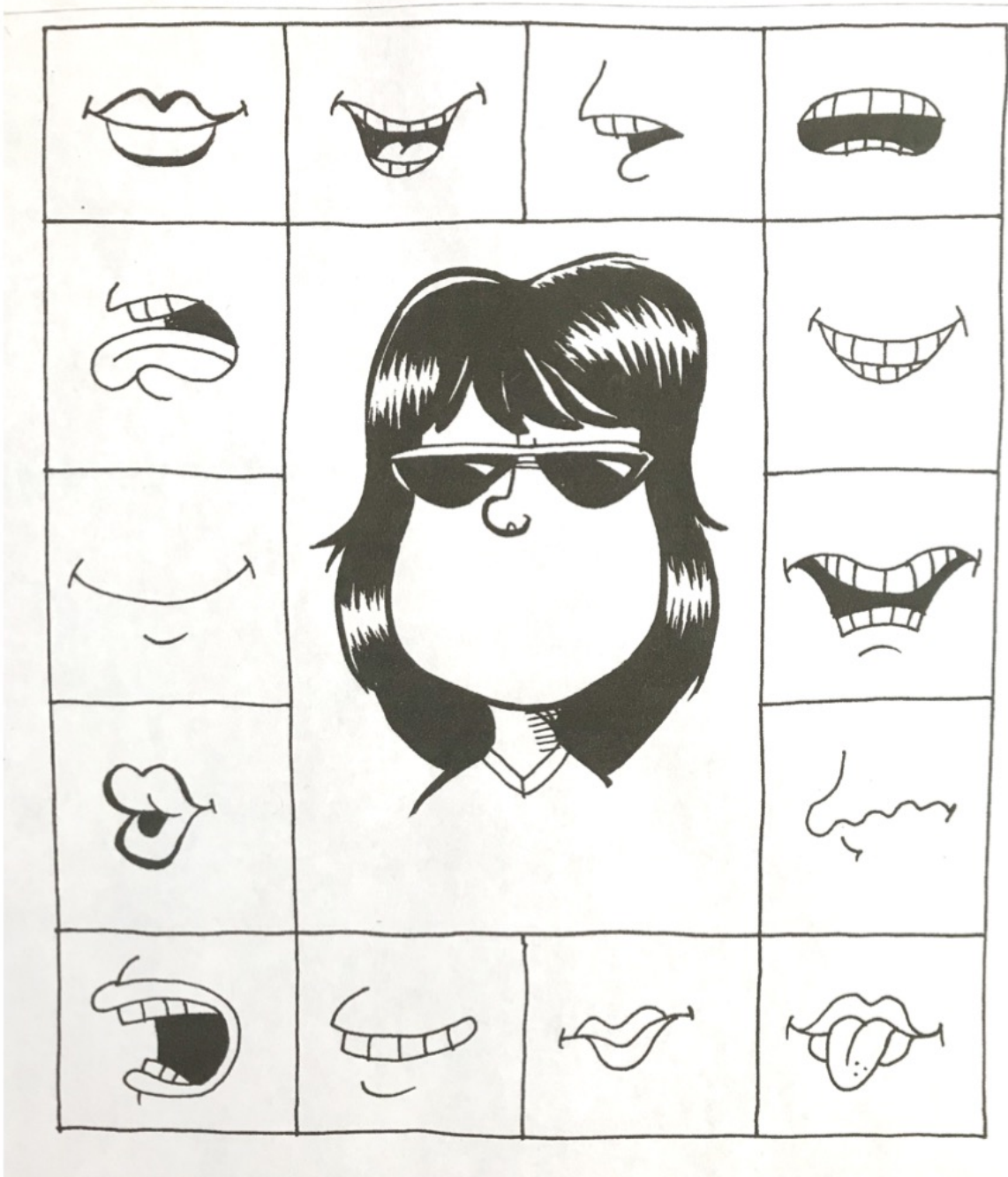
Details: Hair



Draw your favorite hair



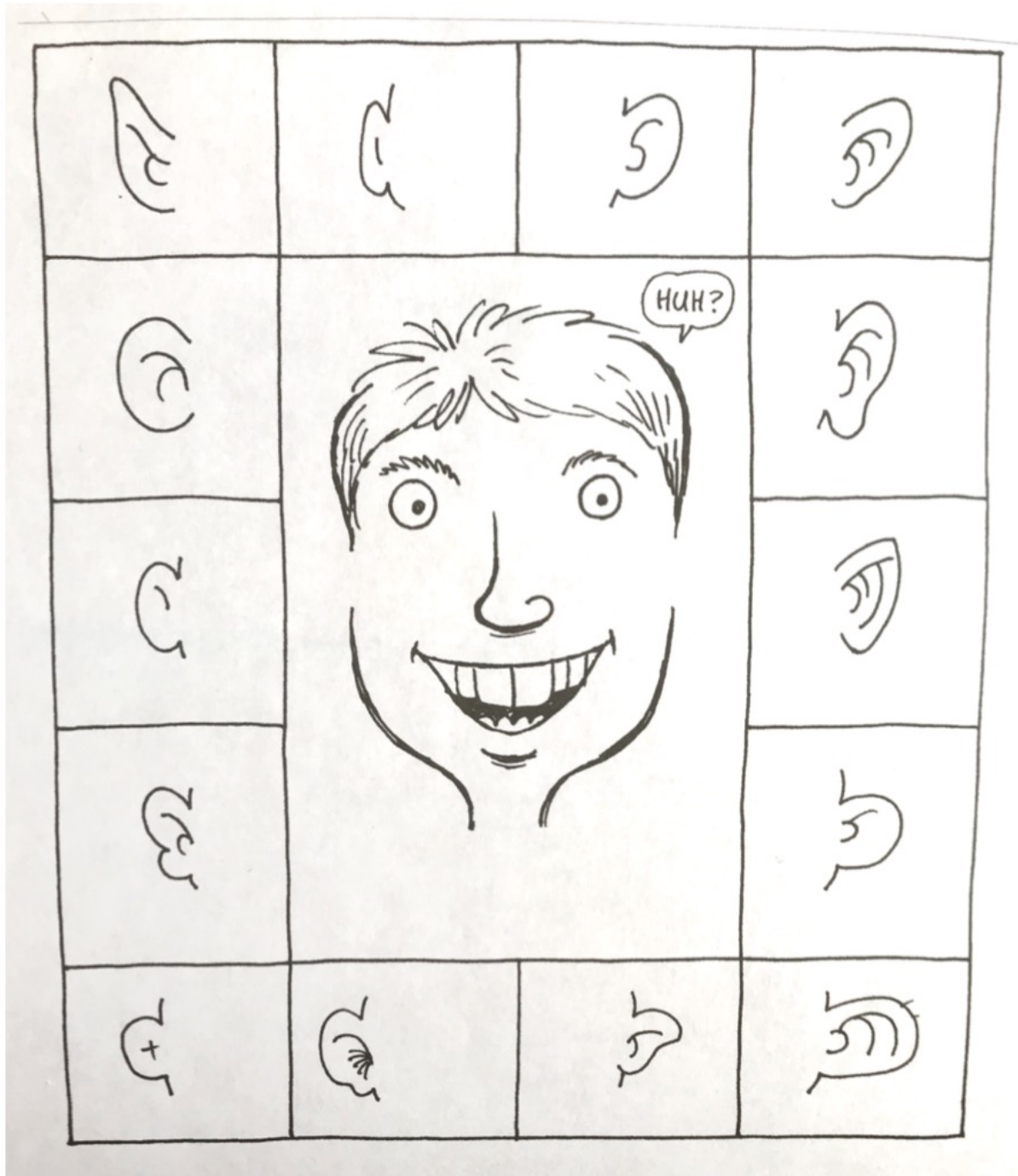
Details: The Mouth

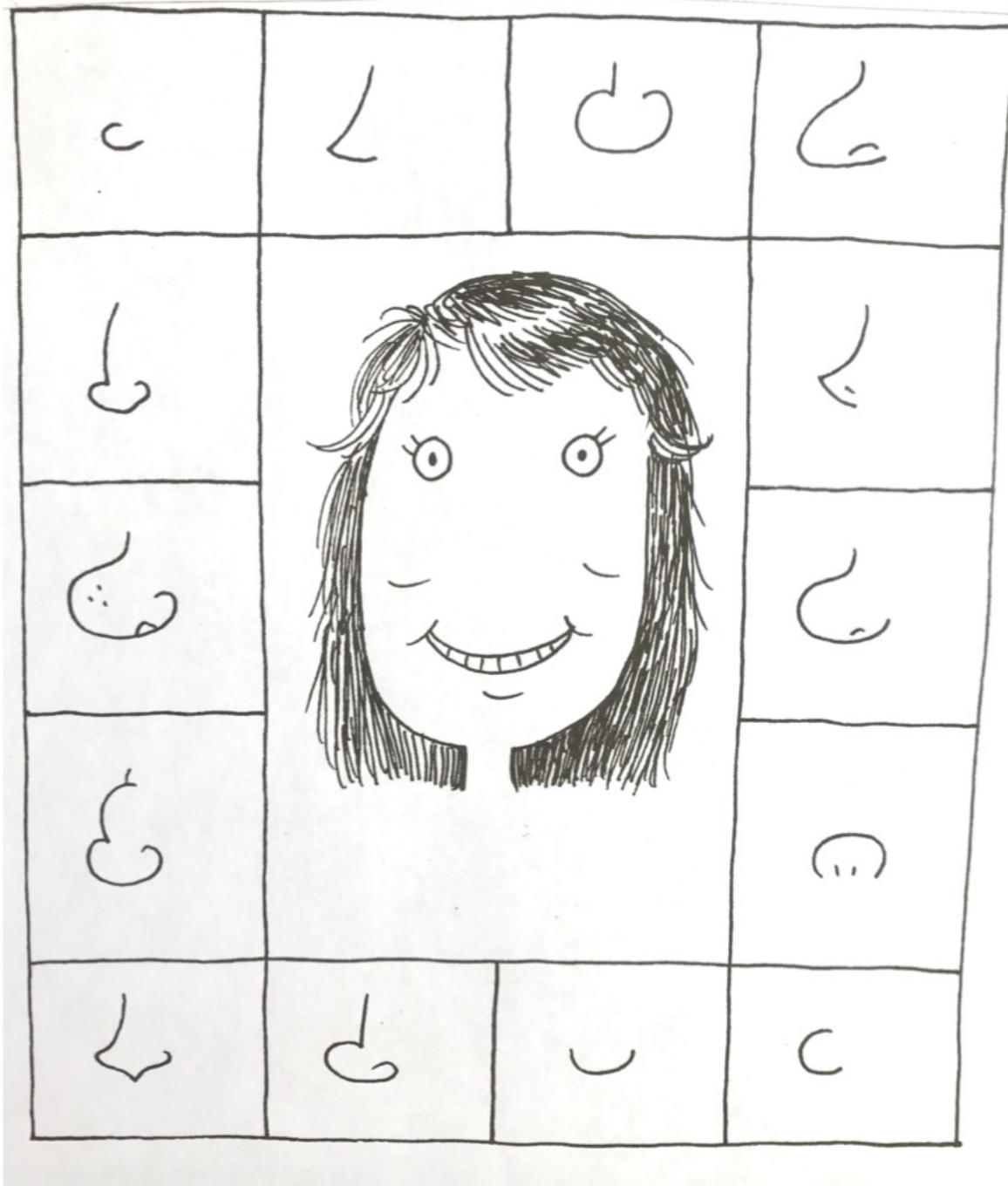
Details: The Ears

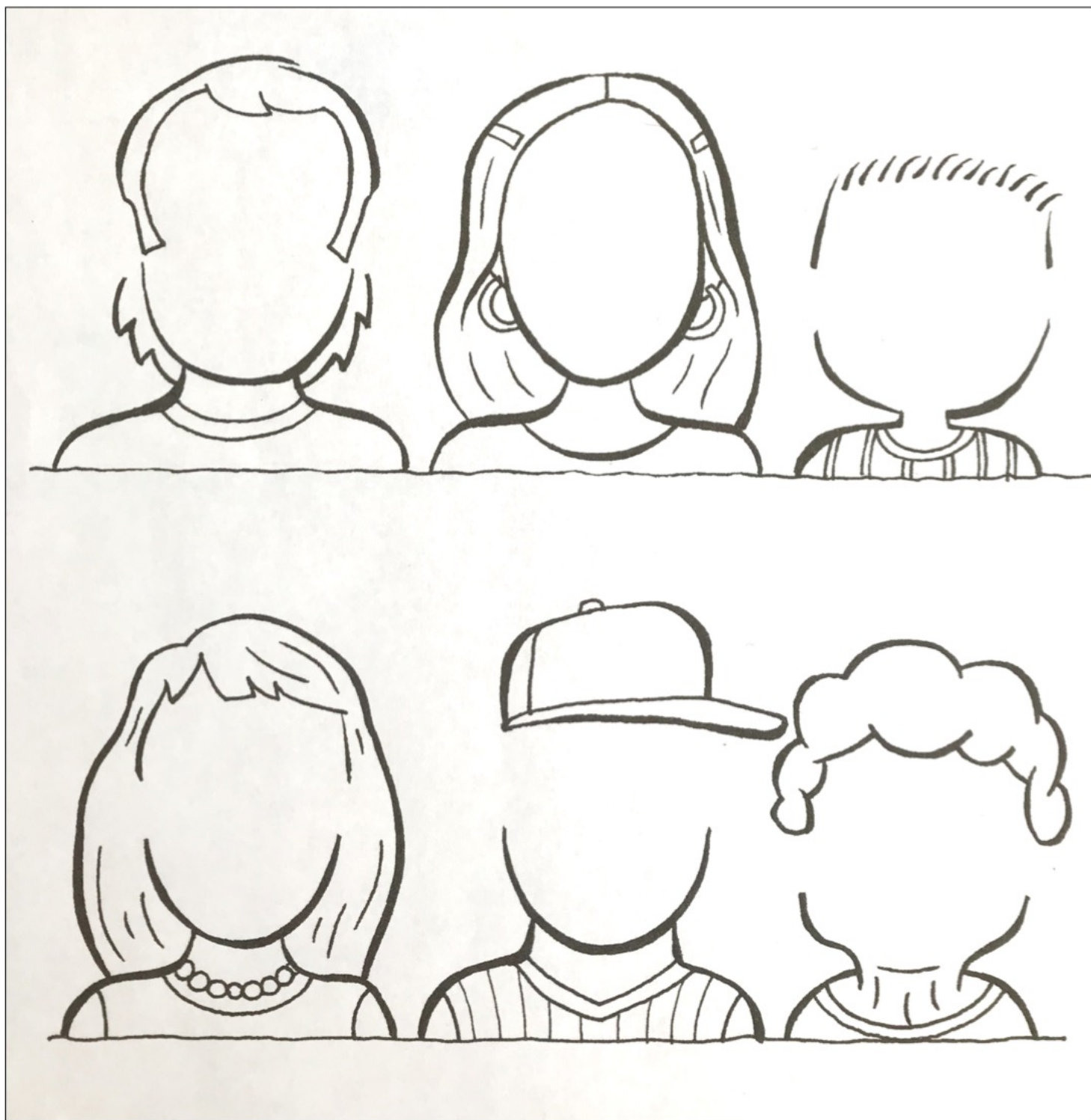
Details: The Nose



Draw your favorite Nose

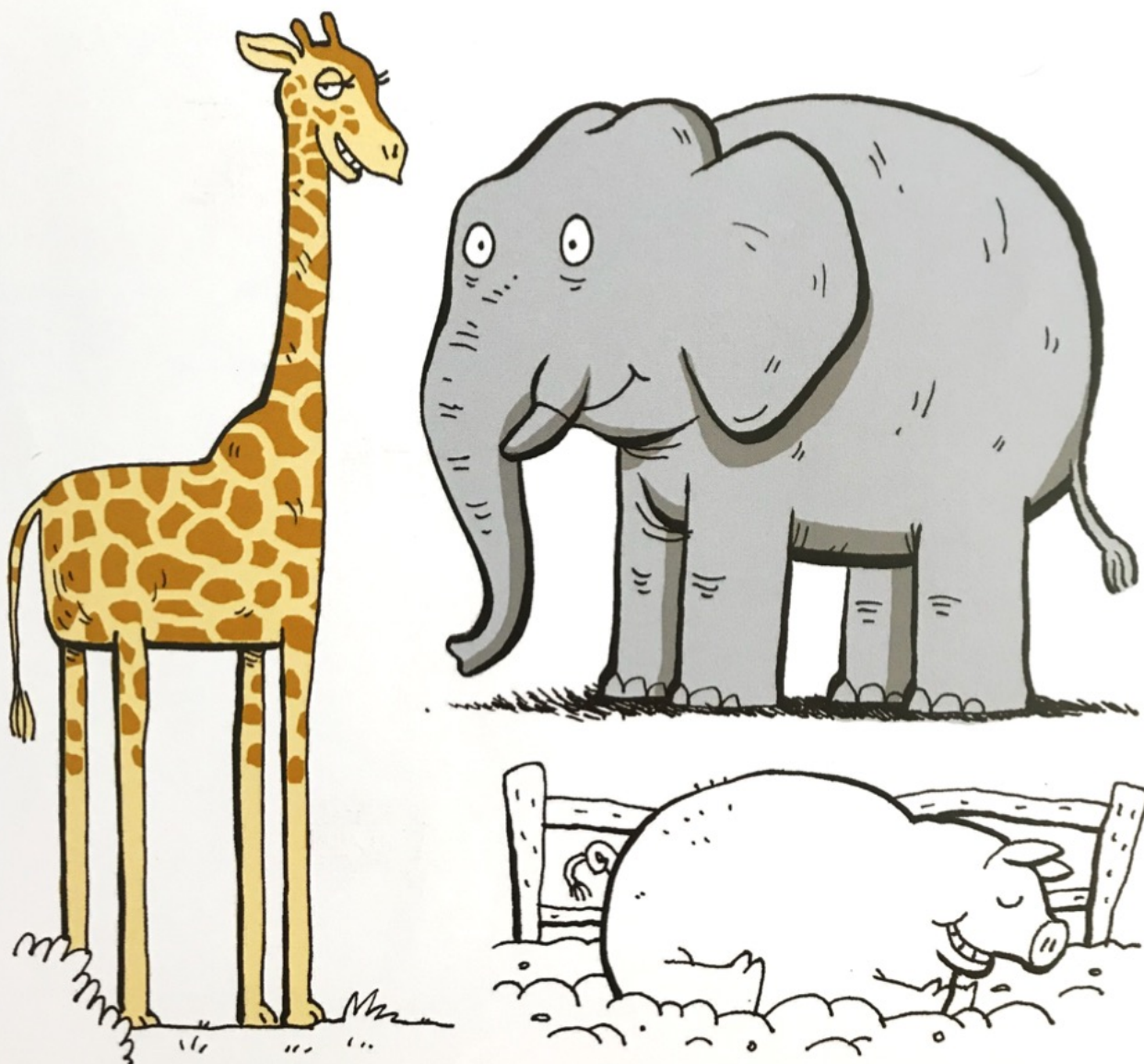
Details: Building Faces

Draw detailed faces on all of these people.

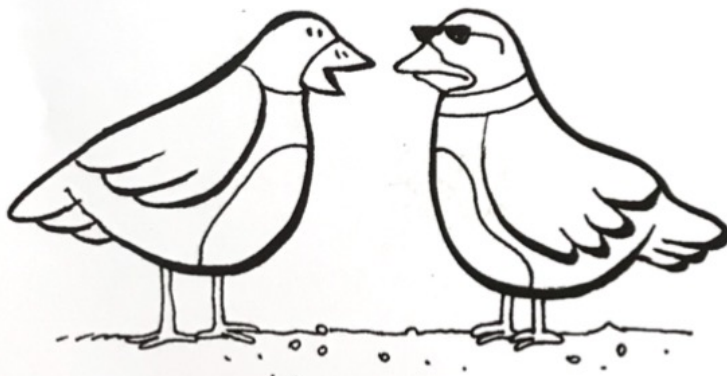
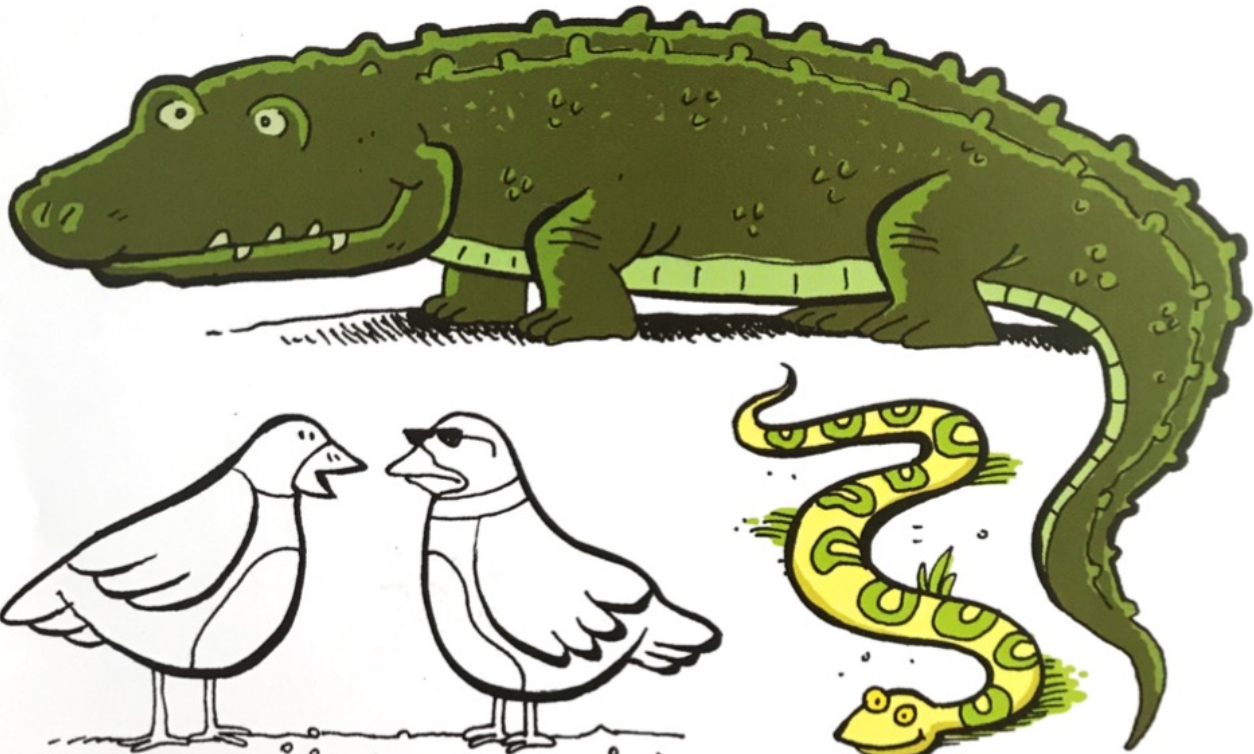
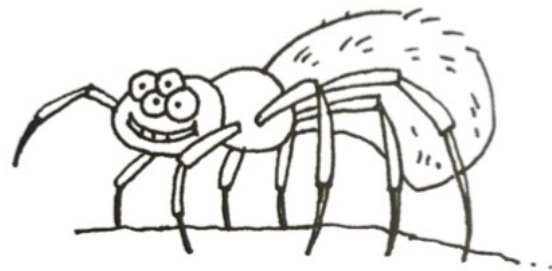
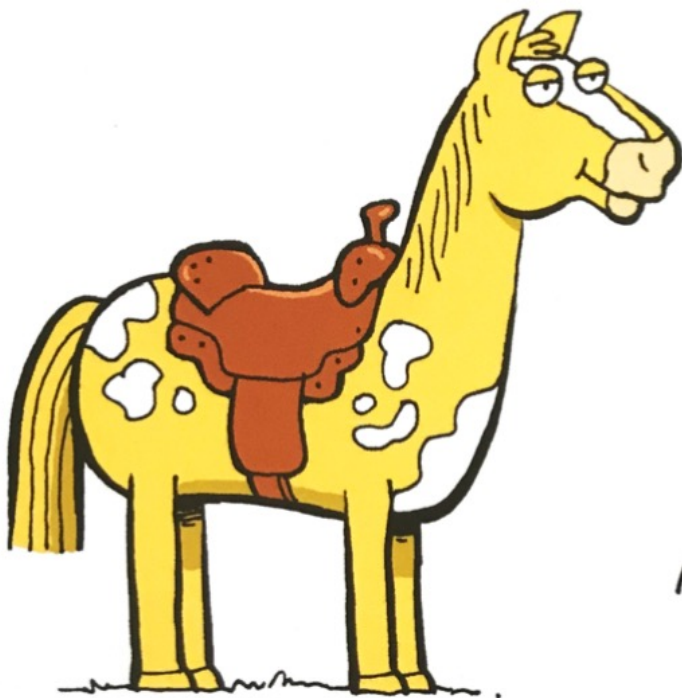


Draw and Color Animals
