- District goal for each teacher to connect with each student each week -personal email exchange, feedback on an online assignment, small group or one-on-one zoom, phone call, etc.
- Multi-Age goal to connect the Home Learning Plan and digital learning opportunities (The Home Learning Plan can be used independently, however it is strengthened by and connected to digital opportunities for learning.
