The First Basic Steps to Create a Cut Out Animal



1 Color and cut out the animal.

Color the animal with crayons, colored pencils, or colored markers. Cut out the animal.




2 Crease in the middle.


You will need to properly crease your paper animal to make it stand upright. First, fold the animal along the middle and unfold.





Crease above the legs.

To allow the animal to stand on its legs, fold both sides near the start of the legs inwards. Unfold.
