- **Reading: Amping our Reading Power & Authors Have Intentions** More reading strategies for tackling tricky words and discovering more about author's purpose lessons we can learn from stories
 - **New Read Aloud:** *The Hundred Dresses* (Historical fiction): About a girl named Wanda, who wears the same dress to school every day, is teased for it and then reveals that she indeed has a hundred dresses in her closet. It's a story of speaking up for those who are different from us, the effects words can have on a person, and how one can make good on poor choices.
- Word Work
 - Spelling 2nd graders have been given 3 challenge words based on their spelling pattern work. You should see these by Monday at the latest on the front of your folder. Voluntary spelling tests begin this week so study those spelling words and look for a new spelling list on the come & go folder in the near future!
 - Shared Reading Reading *Houndsley and Catina and the Birthday Surprise* short vowels, different ways to use vowel teams, inflected endings (-ed, -ly, -er)
 - Making Words gr. 1: Short vowel word families up, in, ig, um & gr. 2: Short e, blends, long vowel patterns, long vowel patterns, inflected endings (fr, cvce i, igh, -ed)

• Writing:

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We are approaching our final bend of our narrative writing unit. Over the next couple weeks, we'll work on revision, editing for handwriting and spelling, re-reading our writing to make it stronger and how to edit with intent.
