#### Last Week, This Week (and Next Week):

- Read Aloud: The One & Only Ivan On Friday we had a nice discussion on identity (who we are and what defines us), specifically Ivan's identity as a caged gorilla in a human world. We've read up a little on gorillas and how they live in groups with a silverback (elder male) leading the pack. We talked about how important it is for us to hold on to things will value that make us who we are.
- **Science/Social Studies**: Shifting into designing our own animal and habitat base on what we've learned in our animal study group designing attributes of our animals, habitat, food, kind of teeth, eggs...?

#### **Classroom Updates**

- **Book Fair Update:** Each student will receive a \$10 voucher towards books during this year's book fair. Feel free to be specific for what your child may use any money they bring in purchasing books. I plan to encourage book purchases and we'll likely not allow tchotchkes or toys to be purchased with the voucher
- Arts Are Elementary Body Mapping: The start of this upcoming weeks marks the final two sessions with AAE artist, Elly Lovin who has designed session that have incorporated a mix of body movement, yoga, mindfulness, curiosity, & spatial awareness to connect to a deeper understanding of how maps are used.
- **Multi-Lingual Mainers** Bowdoin students will meet with our class for a 2<sup>nd</sup> lunch session in early April that will introduce them to a foreign language. <u>HERE</u> is an article from last year's *Forcaster* that details the program at Coffin School (different program name, different books, possibly different languages too)
- April is Poetry Month We'll compile and read a poem a day in the month of April

## Music Grant: Marimba Ensemble visits Coffin School on

**Wednesday May 29** - The Ensemble will work with smaller groups of 1st and 2nd graders to introduce them to the sounds of the marimba, help them create music of a different culture, show them some mechanics of marimba building, and allow them to discover the link between marimba and Zimbabwe.

- Library Grant: STEAM (Science Technology Engineering Art Mathematics) Cart - Funding is provided for a cart designed for various materials for makerspace activities. The cart's mobility allows it to be shared throughout the school.
- Literacy Grant: <u>Little Bird's Flock</u> This project would connect first and second grade writers in the four multi-age classrooms with published young adult authors from The Telling Room through a one-hour visit to each classroom and a set of 12 copies of the book Little Bird's Flock for the multi-age classrooms to share.
- **Behavioral Grant: Mindfulness in The Classroom -** *Provides teachers with resources to foster mindfulness throughout Coffin School. Each classroom will be provided with Yoga cards, reading material and CDs.*
