- o Reading: Building Good Reading Habits, Growing our Reading Skills

- o Social Studies/Study Groups
  - o Last week, we finished our first visit of the year into the other classrooms
  - o This week, we'll read a book titled Ox Cart Man about an early 19th century family in Portsmouth and how they use, trade and make tools, food, & clothing. This will lead nicely into our "Now & Then" field trip to Ft. Western.

o In our room, we'll compare, contrast, & identify Ox Cart Man materials/tools/food from long ago and now

#### Woods Walk/Outdoor Explore

- We've been focusing on having "deer ears", "eagle eyes", & "stalking feet" outdoors while drawing like a scientist (realistic pictures) using our journals
- Expectations while outdoor is to stay with the group, leave nature in its place, respect nature, and remember that our purpose is different from recess. We will have specific goals and focus while outdoors.
- This week, we introduce the woods space to the side of the Jr. HIgh and will practice sitting in the woods in the moment while journaling what we notice. We've really enjoyed these opportunities.
