# Last Week, This Week (and Next Week) We're Working on...

**Reading:** Readers of nonfiction grow their knowledge by learning more/researching topics; nonfiction readers learn the lingo of nonfiction texts by paying attention to text features, re-reading to learn more and to read like an expert

**Writing**: Nonfiction/informational writing - Writers teach! They use text features - text boxes, labels, glossary, bold words to show what they know. Writers write endings. Spelling tips for writing.

**Study Groups:** TBD, but we will cover Science content related to claims and evidence based observations: water cycle, seasons, Day & Night and plants

• Making Words - Gr. 1 (word families ed, id, et en, on, cvce long i & o, & br/st blends br) Gr. 2 (silent g, silent h, cvce long i, endings with -sh, r-controlled vowels: or)

**1st Grade Math: Chapter** - Adding & Subtracting Numbers to 20 - finding multiple strategies to add/subtract **2nd Grade Math: Chapter 2** - Three Digit Addition (with and without regrouping)

- Nonfiction Texts We've received roughly 50 (!) topical texts from the Coffin School Library that have been requested by our classroom readers! Each student receives at least 1 book. All students have access to our extended nonfiction library to learn more about the world around us.
