Minutes New School Playground Committee Meeting January 11, 2018

- 1) Introductions
- 2) Jeanne Stinson agreed to serve as Chair; Corey Perreault agreed to serve as Vice-Chair.
- 3) Jeanne presented information from several years of work by Coffin's playground committee. Hard copies were handed out and an electronic version will be attached.
- 4) The budget number of \$105,600 was presented as part of our meeting agenda. That amount is low to build three playgrounds.
- 5) The town has given the school department an additional 4 acres (near the train tracks) bringing the site to 17. This should provide some space for a "natural" (less built) portion of the playground environment.
- 6) The preschool playground may be used by as many as 60 kids at a time.
- 7) We had a wide-ranging conversation about the ideas generated by "the Coffin plan" falling into 4 major categories: other elements to consider for the playground, other sources of funds to build the playground (grants), questions/parking lot items, and action items before our next meeting:
 - a. Other playground elements to consider:
 - i. Amphitheater/outdoor classroom space similar to Longfellow playground
 - ii. Large wiggle platforms similar to Longfellow playground
 - iii. Turf for the soccer field (not standard size!)
 - iv. Shade
 - v. Natural items to play on logs/rocks/etc.
 - vi. Trail area for classroom and PE use possibly with some challenge elements
 - vii. Drinking fountains!!
 - viii. Garden with water available
 - b. Other potential sources of funding:
 - i. Centre Fund?
 - ii. BCEF?
 - iii. Bowdoin (Common Good?)
 - iv. BTLT?
 - v. Fundraising (perhaps for specific items/features?)
 - c. Questions/Parking Lot:
 - i. Can the landscape be changed to provide some hills?
 - ii. Can we plan snow removal to make sure the piles are usable for the children?
 - iii. How can we provide sand boxes and still consider hygiene?
 - iv. How can we use natural materials for playing and climbing and consider safety for the children?
 - v. What size should each hard surface be and where should it be located? (Consider color!)
 - vi. Begin developing a list of playgrounds worth visiting (one Kim photographed in the past? The one at Pineland? Garden in the Woods? Any features from the Botanical Gardens?)

- vii. Keep in mind that we could partner with other local groups on the nature pieceKurt Stinson is one the conservation commission, Steve Walker and LisaMartin both have connections with Brunswick Topsham Land Trust, others?)
- viii. Plan a site visit for spring
- ix. Next steps -- Develop RFP
- x. Next steps develop plan for grant writing and/or fundraising

- vii. All please review the "Coffin Plan" with a view toward prioritizing our wants/needs for this playground as a new committee (including the addition of the above ideas from this meeting and any others)
