1. Course Overview

My goal for this class is to...

- □ Teach the algebra topics outlined in the "Course Syllabus," provided in a separate document
- □ Help students develop math study skills that they can use throughout high school

2. Materials Students Will Need For Every Class

- Book. It must be covered at all times. Bring your covered book to every class!
- Math binder. A 1½-inch three-ring binder with 4 dividers only used for THIS class!
- Three-hole punch loose-leaf paper (recommend not using spiral paper).
- <u>Pencils</u>. Work completed in <u>pen will NOT be accepted</u>.
- <u>Calculator</u>. When your class starts using calculators, you can use your BJHS calculator or buy a Texas Instruments TI-30X IIS (approximately \$13).
 - Academic Algebra I students will not use calculators until the middle of Quarter 1.
 - <u>Algebra I (CP)</u> students will not use calculators until second semester in late-January.

3. Extra Help... Just ask!!!

- <u>In School Help:</u> My free periods are 3/4B, 5/6B, and 7/8O. Feel free to make a lunch date.
- <u>Before or After School Help:</u> Please schedule appointments to ensure I am available for you. See me before or after class or email me to schedule time.

4. Make-up policy...You are responsible for making up missed work. I will not chase you!

- Excused absences: You have 2 class periods to make up missed assignments, quizzes, and tests to receive full credit, and then all grades will become zeros. For special arrangements, see me the day you return to discuss extensions.
- <u>Unexcused absences</u>: <u>Work will NOT be accepted</u> until an excused absence pass is provided; once again you have 2 class periods to get credit for work.
- <u>Daily Assignments</u> will be posted on the bulletin board for you to see what you missed during your free time. At anytime during the day, feel free to quietly enter my room to write down assignments. Academic Algebra I students will receive an assignment sheet prior to each chapter and it will be also posted on my website.

5. Problem Resolution Process:

As a high school student, YOU are responsible for your actions and performance. I expect students to follow school policies and classroom rules. Proper behavior and attitude is critical for learning in the classroom.

The following actions will be taken if problems occur:

- ✓ <u>Strike 1</u>. Verbal Warning.
- \checkmark Strike 2. See me directly after class to resolve issues.
- ✓ Strike 3. 1-hour detention for the next school day.

- 6. Grading Your grade is weighted based Tests, Quizzes, HW, Class work and your Math Notebook. Check the online FamilyLink system for your current grade.
 - I. Tests (45% of grade) dates will be announced at least 1 week in advance.
 - II. **Quizzes (25% of grade)** may or may not be announced so it is vital to keep up with homework assignments. Many HW problems will be on quizzes. Announced and unannounced quizzes will count the same.
 - III. Homework and Class work (20% of grade) is to practice the skills learned in class. Expect approx. 1 hr of HW each class.

 Math is not a spectator sport!
 - □ **Homework Grading Points**
 - $\sqrt{+}$ (100) **PERFECT-** All problems attempted, work shown, follows HW format.
 - $\sqrt{}$ (90) **GOOD-** Most problems attempted, work shown, follows HW format.
 - √- (70) **FAIR** Incomplete work. Unreadable. Did not follow HS format.
 - R (10) **REDO** assignments for full credit and hand in next class. Students will need to **REDO** HW done in pen and sloppy HW.
 - NW/NC (3) No Work, No Credit. Answers only. Can NOT make up.
 - EA (2) <u>Excused Absence</u>. See Section 4 for how to make up work.
 - UA (1) <u>Unexcused Absence</u>. Work can not be made up.
 - M (0) <u>M</u>issing HW. You loose 10pts each school day late;
 - □ How to Organize Your Homework
 - ◆ How to set up HW page? See "HW example" handout.
 - ✓ Do HW in pencil.
 - ✓ HW needs your full name, date, class period in the top right hand corner of page.
 - ✓ At the beginning of each assigned section: write section, page, & problem #'s.
 - ✓ HW must be well organized and easy to read.
 - ◆ How to show work? "I am looking for Quality"
 - ✓ Always write problem, show work, and circle the final answer!
 - Clearly show all work necessary to show how you obtained your final answer. Show enough work so you can easily explain your work to a classmate.
 - IV. <u>Notebook Tests (10% of grade)</u> A well-organized notebook will help you develop good study skills, provide sample problems to do HW and study for tests, midterm and final exams.
 - □ How to Organize Your Notebook
 - Place this <u>Math Course Guideline</u> and <u>Syllabus</u> documents first in your binder.
 - Label 4 Tabs:
 - ► Notes ► HW/CW (homework/classwork) ► Tests/Quizzes ► Study Tips
 - Organize each tab by section number and date.
 - □ Notes:
 - Put date & section # on all notes & handout.
 - Complete all note taking handouts thoroughly and accurately.
 - □ Grading:
 - Timed Notebook Tests will be given to measure how organized your binder is.
 - □ When can you Clean Up your Notebook?
 - After each Chapter Test, you may remove class work, homework, and guizzes.

1. Be Respectful

☆ Respect others
