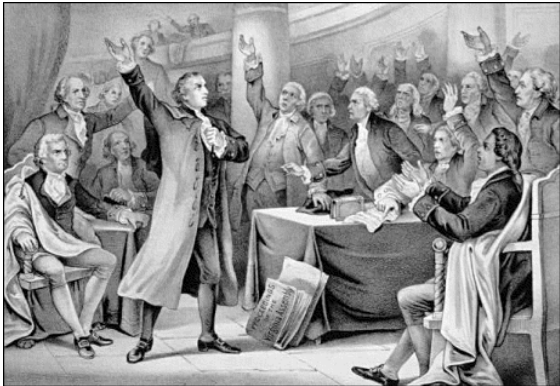


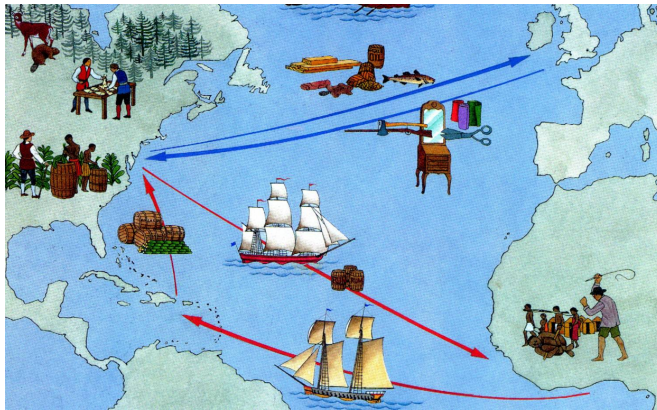

representatives from several colonies met with _____ to try to get them to fight together against the _____

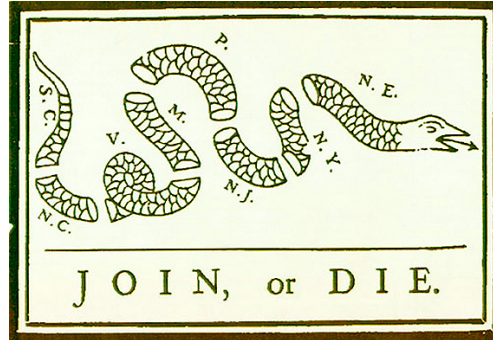
remember: this meeting happened in the middle of the French and Indian War (1754-1763) the Indians and French were fighting against the colonists and British

Boston Massacre

March 5, 1770

began as a harmless
prank (throwing

someone gave the

Paul Revere, a Bostonian silversmith, made the engraving above
it was printed in many newspapers
although only 5 people died, he called the event a “massacre”
he wanted to dramatically illustrate British tyranny (_____)
