Pope Alexander VI (1492-1503) had numerous affairs and children out of wedlock 20% of all priests in the diocese of Trent kept concubines during the early 16th century

Early Critics of the Church



John Wyclif (1328-1384)

English priest, Oxford professor and early critic of the Catholic Church wrote the first English translation of the Bible

supported a return to simplicity and poverty

his followers were called Lollards (nonacademics)

was convicted in absentia of heresy 75 years later

his bones were dug up from consecrated ground and burned with his writings



Jan Hus (1369-1415) Czech priest, philosopher, reformer, and college professor criticized the Church for its corruption, greed led a unsuccessful nationalist movement convicted as a heretic and burned at the stake



Lorenzo Valla (1407-1457) Italian priest who proved the Donation of Constantine was a fake

Roman imperial decree by which the emperor Constantine I transferred authority over Rome to the Pope

Valla proved it couldn't have been written when they claimed it was

convicted as a heretic and burned at the stake
