- Increased Psychologist position at Coffin to full-time
- Reduced Physical Therapy position to half-time
- Replaced Behavior Interventionist position at HBS with a Social Worker
- Added a Social Worker position at BJHS and BHS (1/2 PT, Local Entitlement)
- Increased Department Head position at BJHS to full time
- Dr. Heather Blier Psych consult has been expanded (from HBS) to include one high school student
- Contracted with Dr. Bruce Chemelski to provide consultation, supervision, and professional development

#### STAFFING

- Advertised for half-time Speech/Language position at BJHS (Advertised in PPH and Serving Schools, Private Practice, Agencies)
  - Melissa Madden serves seven students
  - Jessica Pelletier assists with evaluations at Coffin School
  - Liz Swazey provides social skills to some students
  - Leslie Darrell began serving a group of three students in March
  - Some students will receive compensatory services this summer
  - Contracted with Presence Learning to pilot (March 1 through June 30) speech-language telepractice services (the pilot will provide therapy for six students at BJHS and one student at BHS. Able to conduct evaluations and provide compensatory services
