# f. Arts Are Elementary Update – Kristi Hatrick and Kate Kalajainen

AAE is a 36 year old Brunswick non-profit organization whose primary mission is to provide every K-5 classroom in Brunswick with their own teaching artist and their own art residency. An update was given of the work students have done with AAE since November of last year. They also went over their schedule for the remainder of this year. The selection process was explained as well as expenses, income and fundraising.

# g. Budget Report – K. Wentworth

#### h. DOE Efficiency Grant – P. Makin

Our district has contacted neighboring districts, RSU 5, MSAD 75, RSU 1, West Bath School, and Wiscasset, to come together to develop a plan for cost efficiencies for transporting students under the McKinney-Vento Act and out-of-district placement. Work is continuing on a grant which is due the end of next week.

# **Board Chair's Report**

a. Student Liaison Report - Elina Woolever

Next week is winter carnival, spirit week at BHS. Eighteen students have already signed up for a wrestling program at BJHS that was recently approved. The Jewell Team at BJHS received a grant from the Casco Bay Estuary Partnership for their Casco Bay Interdisciplinary unit. HBS third

graders have been working with AAE. Coffin has a program called CUBS: Caught You Being Kind, Safe, and Responsible. They just reached a new record of 1500 student recognitions.
