g. ALICE - P. Makin

ALICE is a system to replace the "lock down" response plan. ALICE program was brought to Brunswick by our BJHS SRO, Tom Stanton. It replaces "hiding" with students and teachers taking a more active role in their safety. It also eliminates code blue or code yellow, and replaces it with plain language. Administrators are working with the Brunswick Police and Fire Departments to update our district safety and emergency response plans. A workshop will be held soon.

They met May 3rd and went over policies that are listed under New Business. These will be discussed later in the meeting.

c. Student Services Committee - M. Merrill

They have not met since the last Board meeting. The next scheduled meeting is scheduled for June 12th at 9:30am.

d. Budget & Finance Committee - B. Tucker

Mr. Tucker went over the budget timeline:

May 11th school budget will be brought to the Town Council.

May 17th the Board has a Special Meeting scheduled at 6:30pm

May 18th Special Meeting with the Town Council, at which time the Council would like to finalize their figures.

May 25th Town Council budget hearing

June 13th Budget Validation Referendum

Based on past discussions, the council may request the Board to reduce our proposed budget an additional \$500,000. If we receive additional subsides from the state after our 2018 budget is finalized, an additional article to the warrant is allowed under the law that would authorize the Board to use the additional state subsides without going through the budget process again. The council may approve language that would authorize the Board to restore the \$500,000, and if we receive additional funds from the state, the additional amount could go toward tax relief. It is recommended by the committee to wait until after the current proposed budget is brought to the Council before any additional budget decisions are made. The Superintendent went over some of the various possibilities of cuts if we have to cut an addition \$500,000. There was some discussion between Board members. Elina, Student liaison, eloquently shared her thoughts on the school budget.

e. Wellness Committee - E. Sokoloff

The committee met on April 24th. The various wellness activities at each school were reviewed. The progress of the revised Student Nutrition Policy, of which we heard a presentation tonight, was discussed. (The revised policy was passed unanimously by the Policy Committee). Future goals, professional development concerning non-food rewards, student activity and movement in all schools were discussed.
