d. Budget Report – J. Oikle

Close out is not completed but will be ready for the auditors. Employee self-serve is up and running for all hourly employees so eliminating paper time cards. Employee self-serve system also allows employees to access their own personal leave so they don't have to call to ask for it.

e. Science Grant Presentation - BHS

Presentations were given by Rick Wilson and Andrew McCullough on two grants: A grant from the Brunswick Community Education Foundation was received to allow the entire 9th grade class to attend Camp Ketcha in Scarborough on September 6th, freshman transition day. There were 155 freshman, 25 upper-class mentors, and 22 faculty/staff who were involved in activities promoting communication, teamwork, and problem solving.

A \$30,000 STEM Workforce Development Partner Mini-Grant for projects that help to develop Maine's current and future workforce in STEM. The town will be giving them a 50'x100' "piece of mud" at Maquoit Bay dedicated to student use and studying shellfish harvesting, Marine Science.

- f. Statement of Commitment to Employee Health and Well Being P. Makin
 Brunswick School Department is committed to the safety and well being of their employees. We have a Safety Committee meeting in every building every month. The wellness team is looking into an initiative that is being offered through the health insurance.
- g. School Climate Survey P. Makin

Last spring we conducted a district-wide school climate survey. With the information received from that survey administrators and staff reviewed the data; conferred with the National School Climate Center; identified strengths and concerns; are developing steps to address the concerns; and identified staff, student, parent, and community member values. From this we developed 3 themes: Student Success, Community Connections, and Professional Excellence.

h. HBS Principal Search Update – P. Makin

We have an 18 member search team who will be meeting tomorrow night to make their final decision. Three possible outcomes: send forward the name of one person; send forward the name of both candidates; or do not send forward either name.
