# f. Budget Report - K. Wentworth

Reviewed the July 31, 2019 Expense and Revenue Report. We are preparing for the new school year. Everything is running smoothly.

# g. Update Cub Camp - S. Ciembroniewicz

This is our 5<sup>th</sup> year of Cub Camp. We used a new screening tool this year called the DIAL. There were two sessions, 15 students at each session. Each session had one teacher and one ed tech. The focus was on a lot of read aloud, literacy, math, and purposeful play. We had many high school volunteers and one junior high school volunteer to help with the program. We had great student progress. One question for the future is whether we continue with Cup Camp once we start Pre-K classes.

## h. Update on Summer School – B. Gunn

The purpose of the Special Education extended school year program is to help students maintain skills through the summer. It is an individualized program and was held Monday thru Thursday, from July 8 to August 8 at three schools. Many thanks to the transportation and IT departments for helping us serve our students this summer. It was a successful program.

# i. Update on Asylum Seekers – S. Lambert and S. Singer

The task force met on July 24 and August 7 and is made up of School Board members, Town Council members, the Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent. Sarah Singer is the chair and Selena Harrison and Teresa Gillis are our Board representatives. Brunswick town hired a cultural broker whose purpose is to work with the community of Brunswick and communities where the asylees are coming from. We want to make sure that cultural issue as well as language issues are addressed. The school department has created experience English camps whose primary objective is language acquisition. They meet at the library and have been broken-up into different age groups: an elementary level, an adolescent level and an adult level. Registration will be held at Coffin School next week so we are not sure of the enrollments at this time. Programming will be based on individual needs so at this time we don't know what those will be. We do have an ESL entry plan in place but until assessments and screening are done we won't know the exact needs. A number of the asylees are interested in athletics, and some have already made connections. With the closing of the Portland Expo this week we believe seven more families may be coming to Brunswick. Midcoast Hunger as well as local health care professionals have been helping to make sure needs are met.

# j. School Board Workgroups

Paul, Elizabeth, and Joy are looking at the procedures of athletic teams. They have looked at paperwork that the athletes and families receive and will continue to review these at the high school and junior high and provide some feedback and possible recommendations for updates.

# k. Food Shaming Update – S. Lambert

Mr. Lambert explained PL2019, an act recently passed which prevents food shaming. The intent of this act is to prevent schools from denying meals to eligible students, punishing students who received a meal but can't pay for it, or stigmatizing students for a debt they hold from not paying for previous meals. All staff will be trained on this. The belief is that student debt will increase.
