Essential Understandings	 The creative process in art involves a variety of strategies and problem solving skills to express ideas, thoughts and moods.
Essential Questions	 What creative thinking strategies, processes and problem solving skills do artists use? How does an artist manipulate materials to express ideas, thoughts, and moods?
Essential Knowledge	 Artists use the creative process to plan and explore ideas for their work. Artists use a sketchbook or journal to document the creative process. Artists explore their individual expression and point of view during the creative process. Artists engage in the creative thinking and problem solving as part of the creative process.
