Essential Knowledge	 Appropriate care includes medical checkups and knowledge of possible complications. Understanding personal genetic history enables one to make informed health decisions. Birth defects may be caused by heredity and environmental influences. Infertility has a number of potential causes and solutions. The "super twins" phenomenon is a result of fertility treatment. The stages of childbirth have distinct signs and events. Expectant mothers have many decisions to make about the birthing experience.
