Essential Understandings	 Infants add considerable cost to a family's budget. Infants need protection. The arrival of an infant requires adjustment. Bonding is an essential process for an emotionally healthy baby. Breastfeeding is the preferred option for infant feeding according to the American Academy of Pediatrics. Individual development can be enhanced by the attention of parents and other caregivers.
Essential Questions	 What does it cost to raise an infant? What steps does one take to protect an infant? How can one facilitate the adjustment to raising an infant? How does bonding occur and what can interfere with it? Why is breastfeeding beneficial for infant and mother? How can parents and other caregivers enhance an infant's development during the first year?
Essential Knowledge	 The expense of raising a baby can be controlled through careful budgeting. The safety of nursery equipment and an infant's surroundings are essential for the infant's survival. The incidence of Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS) has been reduced considerably by following prescribed precautions. Caregivers must be knowledgeable about the effects of Shaken Baby Syndrome to prevent long-term damage or death. Parents of an infant must learn to manage their time, rest, and relationship differently. Sibling rivalry can be lessened by thoughtful inclusion and parental attention. Bonding and nurturing contribute to lifelong healthy relationships. Postpartum depression can interfere with bonding and may require the support of family and friends. Breastfeeding provides a baby with perfect nourishment and boosts the baby's immune system. Babies develop in the same sequence, but at an individual rate. Development can be enhanced by quality parental interactions.
